Andreas Schaller

Andreas Schaller is been a full professor of plant physiology and biotechnology at the University of Hohenheim since 2002. He has made seminal contributions to the field of peptide hormone biogenesis and signaling. For many years, Andreas worked on the large family of subtilases as candidate proteases for the maturation of signaling peptides, which are involved in the biogenesis and activation of plant

peptide hormones. In addition, Andreas significantly contributed to our understanding of dirigent proteins, which are responsible for the stereochemical control of metabolic reactions in biosynthetic pathways. Andreas joined ASPB as a PhD student, and he has been an active member ever since. He has served the plant community in many ways, publishing regularly in *Plant Physiology* and *The Plant Cell*, frequently serving as a reviewer for these journals, and contributing to Plant Biology meetings whenever possible.
